Visual artist, whose artwork has been exhibited at solo and group exhibitions.

Since 1983, a member of the Croatian Association of the Artists of Fine Arts.

Author of two books: *Kako nacrtati osjećaj (How to Draw Feelings)*, on art therapy (2000); *Letjeti i vratiti se (To Fly and Come Back)* – short stories (2010), both illustrated with the author's *drawings - poems*.
